This leaflet explains the role of the Electoral Office for Northern Ireland

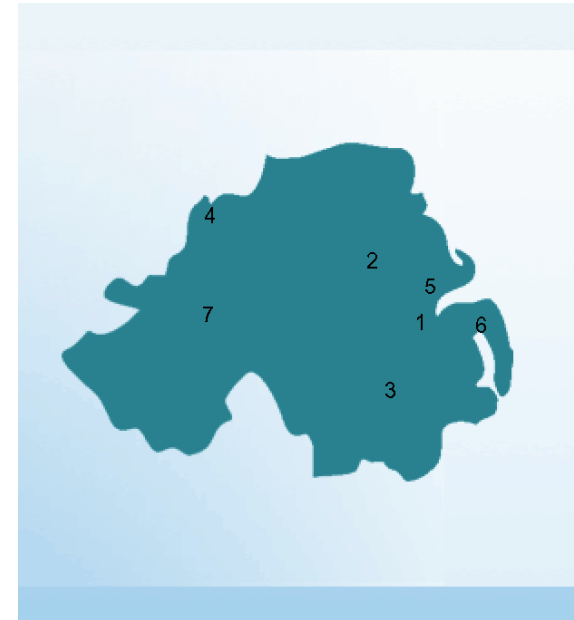
Electoral Office for Northern Ireland

The Chief Electoral Officer administers elections and compiles the Register of Electors in Northern Ireland. He is independent of Government and is assisted in his duties by the staff of the Electoral Office for Northern Ireland. The current Chief Electoral Officer is Douglas Bain.
