Useful information

- Providing false information on this form is a criminal offence for which you could be sent to prison for up to six months or fined £5000 or both. If you have been asked to complete this form, not providing the information is an offence for which you could be fined up to £1000.
- You can only vote at elections if your name is on the register of electors.
- The register may be used by people to decide whether or not to give you credit. If you are not on the register, you may find it difficult to get a loan, to open a bank account or get credit.

Use this form to register to vote or update your details (if your name, address or signature has changed). Remember that this form contains personal information which could be of interest to criminals. You should return it only to the Electoral Office for Northern Ireland.

- We need one form for each person.
- You must give your date of birth and your National Insurance number and sign the form yourself - no-one else can sign it for you.
- You must be a British, Irish, Commonwealth or European Union citizen, and you must give your nationality on the form.
- You must have lived in Northern Ireland for the last three months.

When we receive the form, we will check the information you have given. We will change or add your details on the register within six weeks if we accept your application. We will send you a letter of confirmation which will also give the date the changes come into effect.

If we need more information we will write to you. We may ask for proof of the information you have given.

The full and edited electoral registers

The edited register. If you tick the 'edited register' box, your name and address will not appear on the edited register, which anyone can buy or use for any purpose. Any person, company or organisation including 'junk-mail' companies can buy a copy of the edited register for business activities such as marketing.

The full register lists the name and address of everyone who is registered. By law, certain public organisations and people, including politicians, can receive the full register. Anyone can look at it but it is a crime to supply or use the information for purposes other than those allowed by law. Credit-reference agencies can use the full register, but only to check your name and address if you are applying for credit.

The electoral identity card

If you do not have a passport, driving licence, Translink Senior SmartPass, 60+ SmartPass, War Disabled SmartPass or Blind Person's SmartPass, you will require an electoral identity card to vote at elections in Northern Ireland. Tick the "Electoral ID Card" box and enclose with your form a colour passport sized photograph (write your name and date of birth on the back of the photo) along with a form of photographic identity. If you do not have photographic identity we will accept a declaration form completed by an MP, MEP, MLA or Councillor. Alternatively you can apply in person at an Area Office where your photo will be taken free of charge and photographic identity will not be required. Use of personal information

The information given on your application form may be provided to bodies responsible for auditing and administering public funds for the purposes of preventing and detecting fraud.

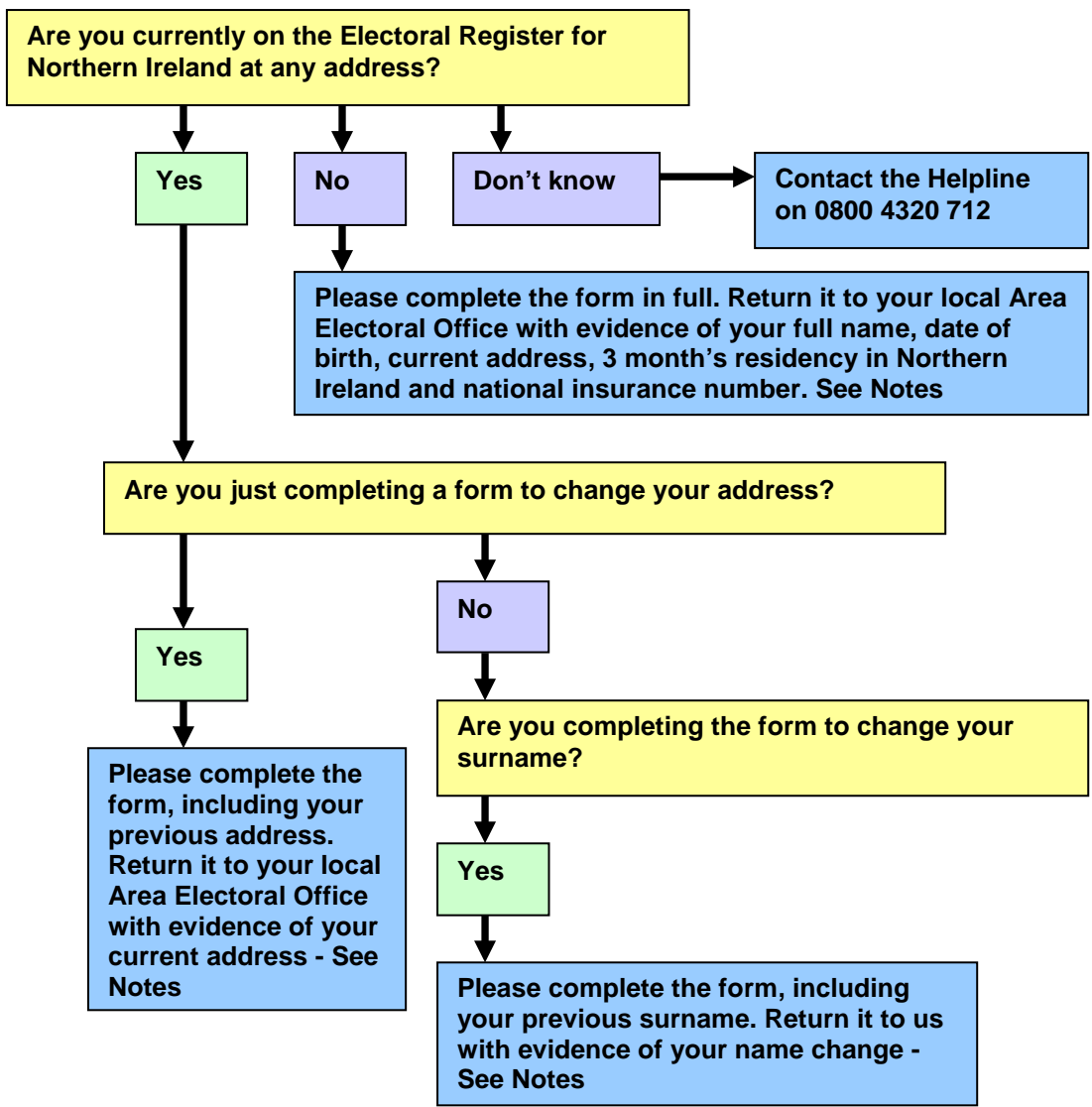

REGISTRATION EVIDENCE REQUIREMENTS – SUMMARY GUIDANCE



REGISTRATION EVIDENCE REQUIREMENTS – NOTES

You may need to provide documentary evidence to support your application. Any documents you send in **must be originals** - photocopies will not be accepted.

The types of documents required are listed below. If you are unable to provide any of the documents listed please phone the Electoral Office Helpline on 0800 4320 712.

Proof of Address

To prove that you are living at the address stated on the registration form, any of the following documents, which **must be dated within the last three months** prior to the date on your registration form, are acceptable:

- full or provisional NI driving licence showing your current address
- utility or landline (not mobile) telephone bill in your name
- Post Office, bank or building society statement
- Credit or debit card statement
- mortgage statement
- Land and Property Services Agency bill or statement (Rates bill/statement)

Proof of Residency

To prove that you have been resident in Northern Ireland for at least three months prior to the date on the registration form, any of the documents used to prove your address may also be used to prove your residency, provided they are **more than 3 months and less than 6 months old**.

Proof of Date of Birth

To prove that you are over 16, any of the following documents are acceptable:

- Birth certificate
- Certificate of Marriage or Civil Partnership
- Driving licence
- Passport issued by a Commonwealth country or Member State of the European Union
- Citizencard, Electoral Identity Card or any card bearing the PASS logo
- Translink SmartPass (Senior, Blind Person's or War Disabled)

Proof of Name

To prove your name, any of the documents used to prove your date of birth are acceptable, along with the following:

- Certificate of change of name by deed poll
- Death certificate of a spouse
- Decree absolute of divorce
- Adoption certificate

Proof of National Insurance Number

To prove your national insurance number, any of the following documents are acceptable:

- a National Insurance Card
- a letter from the National Insurance Number Helpline 0845 9157 006.
