

Polling Places for combined May 2027 Northern Ireland Assembly and Local Government Elections Consultation Document



1. Introduction

- (a) The Electoral Office for Northern Ireland is undertaking a review of Polling Places for the combined **2027 Northern Ireland Assembly and Local Government Elections**. The UK Government has scheduled the two elections to take place on the same day, **6 May 2027**.
- (b) The purpose of this consultation is to **invite comments on the Polling Places to support the combined polls on 6 May 2027**. In particular, the review considers whether the combined Polling Place Scheme provides electors with practical arrangements for voting.
- (c) This consultation is being conducted in the context of changes arising from the **2023 Review of Parliamentary Constituencies**. By law Northern Ireland Assembly constituencies must be based on Parliamentary Constituencies, therefore this change is relevant to the 2027 Assembly elections. Thus the **18 Assembly Areas** for the 2027 Assembly elections will differ from those in the 2022 Assembly elections. At the same time, Local Government elections continue to be organised within the **80 District Electoral Areas (DEAs)** established under the **Local Government (Boundaries) Act (Northern Ireland) 2008**.
- (d) As part of the 2023 **Review of Parliamentary Constituencies** the 18 Parliamentary Constituencies/Assembly Areas now align with Local Government ward boundaries. This means that the electoral geography in Northern Ireland is built up from 109 distinct Constituency / District Electoral Area overlap units. However, because these units are derived from the existing Local Government ward boundaries, the scheme must operate within boundaries that remain largely based on the framework established following the Local Government (Boundaries) Act (Northern Ireland) 2008.
- (e) As 2027 elections are planned to be combined Assembly and Local Government Elections, these 109 geographical units are central to delivery. **Therefore, the Electoral Office have developed a combined Polling Place scheme to allow voters to visit one Polling Place to cast their votes in both elections**. This is an improvement to the last area-based combined poll in 2011, when some voters had to visit two Polling Places to vote.

2. Why a Combined Polling Place Scheme Is Required

- (a) As the United Kingdom Government has decided to run two elections on a single day – this presents a significant operational task. This has meant that the Electoral Office, working closely with Local Councils, has had to consider how best to run the combined elections to minimise complexity both for the voter and the administration of the election.
- (b) Local Government elections are organised around 80 District Electoral Areas, while Assembly elections are organised around 18 Assembly Area constituency boundaries. In most cases (53 out of 80 DEAs) the District Electoral Area is contained within the Assembly constituency. In the remaining cases the District Electoral Area is split across either two Assembly constituencies (25 out of 80 District Electoral Areas) or across three Assembly constituencies (2 out of 80 DEAs – Faughan & Lagan River). This is outlined in Annex A. Therefore, some electors within the same District Electoral Area will vote in different Assembly constituencies¹.
- (c) Without proper planning the combined election would mean electors having to attend two different Polling Places to vote. Therefore, the Electoral Office have developed a Polling Place scheme to cater for the 109 distinct Constituency / District Electoral Area units – the overlap of the two electoral geographies. This then allows electors to only visit one Polling Place to cast their votes in both elections.
- (d) This position helps avoid voter confusion and administrative error. The combined Polling Place scheme provides a clear and efficient approach to the combined election. The principal objectives of the combined Polling Place scheme are to:
 - reduce voter confusion by simplifying voting; and
 - make the administration of two elections manageable.
- (e) **In summary the Electoral Office will ensure all electors are assigned to a single Polling Place to cast both their votes.**

3. Purpose of the Review/Consultation

- (a) The Electoral Office plans to ensure polling arrangements for the 2027 combined elections are fit for purpose. This consultation will assist the Electoral Office in ensuring that:
 - voting is as convenient for the public as possible;
 - the public are directed to a single Polling Place to cast their vote in both elections; and
 - Polling Places are accessible and operationally viable.
- (b) The consultation provides an opportunity for councils, political parties, community organisations, lobby groups, electors and other interested stakeholders to comment on the suitability of the combined Polling Places.

¹ The development of a combined Polling Place scheme is constrained by the 80 District Electoral Areas (DEA) arising from the 2008 Local Council legislation. These DEA boundaries relate to decisions made now nearly twenty years ago. For some DEAs, the boundaries align with an historical town boundary which does **not** include newly built houses on the outskirts of the town. This makes the combined Polling Place scheme a function of historical DEA boundaries.

(c) Therefore this consultation seeks:

- comments on specific Polling Places and alternative locations;
- information from respondents on large-scale external issues (public realm works, events etc...) planned for 6 May 2027 – election day - at or near the listed Polling Places (see 3(d) below); and
- views on a future (beyond the 2027 elections) rationalisation of Polling Places (see 4(f) below).

(d) Whilst developing the draft combined Polling Places scheme, the availability of individual Polling Places was reviewed (i.e. for building specific works /closure). **However, the Electoral Office did not consider external issues that may impact on Polling Places on 6 May 2027 (e.g. public realm works, major events (North West 200 etc...)). In undertaking this consultation the Electoral Office are seeking to identify any information on external issues that might impact on the delivery of the May 2027 combined elections.**

4. Key Principles that underpinned the Combined Polling Place Scheme

(a) In conducting this review, the Electoral Office has used a series of principles.

(b) **Principle 1:** As a result of the combined election, the Electoral Office will ensure **all electors are assigned to a single Polling Place to allow them to vote in both the Assembly & Local Government elections at the same time.**

(c) **Principle 2:** Polling Places are designed **so the number of electors allocated to that Polling Place can be accommodated in numerical terms.**

(d) **Principle 3:** Polling Places are chosen as far as possible to support **accessibility requirements.**

(e) **Principle 4:** Polling Places must be able to accommodate the operational requirements of combined elections, including equipment, voter flow, and ballot paper handling. Therefore the draft combined Election Polling Place scheme has been developed with **a limited change approach. In total around 95% of properties have been assigned to the Polling Place they were previously assigned to.**

(f) Lastly, the number of Polling Places in Northern Ireland is 30% more than the number of Polling Districts². Following the 2027 election the Electoral Office plan to reduce the number of Polling Places³. To do so the Electoral Office will use information from the election along with digital mapping/Geographical Information System methods. **In undertaking this consultation**

the Electoral Office are looking for any comments from respondents about which Polling Places could be combined following the 2027 elections.

5. Developing of Proposals / Evidence Base

(a) In preparing the proposals, the Electoral Office has:

- reviewed existing arrangements and assessed Polling Places used at previous elections with feedback from poll staff and voters at the July 2024 Parliamentary elections;
- examined the impact of new constituencies introduced under Parliamentary Constituencies Act 2020;
- reviewed the relationship between 18 Assembly Constituencies and 80 District Electoral Areas to develop the draft Combined Polling Place scheme;
- where necessary, undertaken in-person assessments of Polling Places;
- applied operational principles relating to accessibility, travel distance & election delivery;
- taken account of population change, housing development and local factors; and
- held initial engagement with stakeholders.

6. Proposed Polling Places – Documents Available

(a) The proposed combined Polling Place scheme is set out in the spreadsheets and maps which accompany the consultation document. These are all available on our website.

(c) The Electoral Office has made available a mapping tool <https://nielectoral-maps.wheredoivote.co.uk>, where the Polling Places and all properties (with and without electors) linked to that Polling Place can be viewed on a map.

(d) The full list of addresses (with and without electors) attached to each Polling Place (broken down in 11 files – one for each Local Government District) is available at <https://www.eoni.org.uk/consultations> Note this includes all addresses held within the Electoral Office electoral management system including those addresses that have no registered voters⁴.

(e) Key statistics are also shown overleaf with the geographical breakdown of the 604 Polling Places by Local Council & Assembly Area.

- (i) **Are the proposed Polling Places acceptable for electors? If not, what alternative Polling Place(s) would you recommend?**

Annex: Relationship between Northern Ireland Assembly Areas & Local Government District Electoral Areas

- (a) The information & maps below illustrate the **relationship between District Electoral Areas (DEAs) & Assembly Areas**.

Local Council District Electoral Areas (2027 Election)

- (b) In total there are 80 District Electoral Areas – these areas are used for elections to elect Councillors and are split across the 11 Council Areas. All Councils except Belfast have 7 District Electoral Areas and these are built up from 462 Electoral Wards. This is shown in Table 1 & Map 1 below.

Thus the 80 District Electoral Areas are made up from 462 electoral wards (as whole units) which are also coterminous with the Councils.

- (c) In total there are 18 Assembly Areas. These are the areas used in the context of changes arising from the **2023 Review of Parliamentary Constituencies** - these areas are named similarly to those used in the 2022 Assembly but do not cover the same geography.
- (d) The 18 Assembly Areas are made up from electoral wards as distinct units. However, 12 electoral wards (out of 462) were split in 2 setting up the 18 Constituencies – this gives rise to the 474 “wards” in Table 2 below. Table 2 also denotes the number of District Electoral Areas that are wholly or in part in each constituency – this gives rise to the 109 areas on the ground.

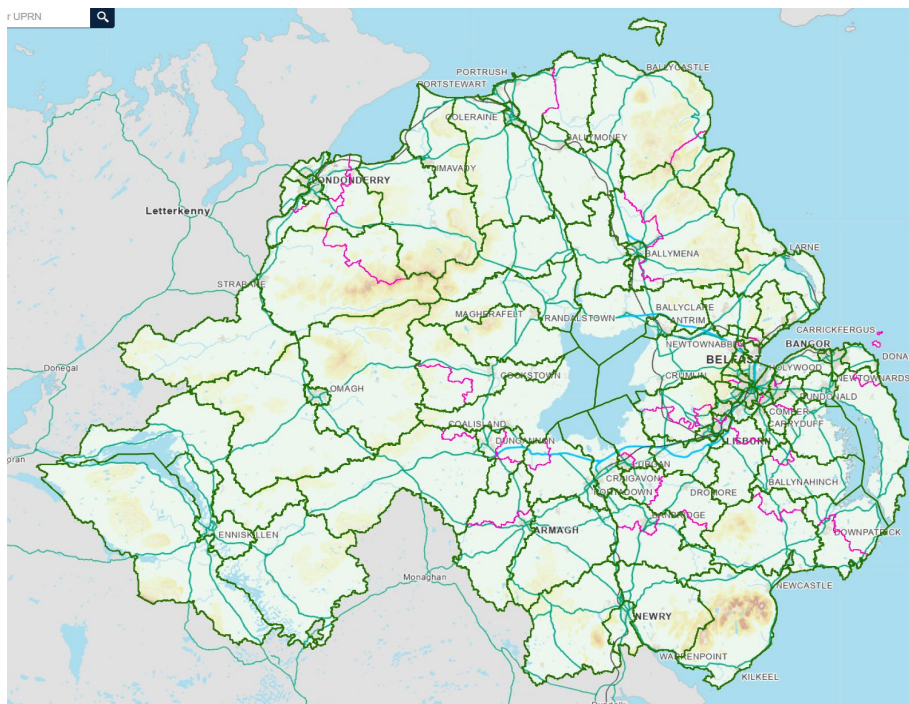

(e) As there is a combined election planned for May 2027 – a combined Polling Place scheme has been necessary to enable voters to go to a single Polling Place. The two boundaries **(Assembly Areas & District Electoral Areas)** do not wholly align. There is however overlap. **This is shown in Map 3 below.** In total there are 109 combined areas, and the Polling Place scheme has been designed to meet these combined areas. The 109 areas are shown in Table form overleaf with the names of the Assembly Areas & District Electoral Areas attached.
